AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PEVELY, MISSOURI, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AND EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE DUNKLIN R-5 SCHOOL DISTRICT, FOR THE PURPOSE OF LEASING A PARCEL OF LAND COMMONLY KNOWN AS PEVELY PARK I.

WHEREAS, the City of Pevely, Missouri ("City") wishes to authorize the Mayor to enter into a lease agreement with the Dunklin R-5 School District ("School District") for the purpose of leasing a parcel of land commonly known as Pevely Park I; and

WHEREAS, the City and School District have operated under a lease agreement for this particular parcel for several years and the Board of Aldermen of the City deem it advisable and in the best interest of the City and the community to authorize the Mayor to execute such an agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PEVELY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the City to execute and enter into a lease agreement with the Dunklin R-5 School District for the purpose of leasing a parcel of land commonly known as Pevely Park I.
- Section 2. The proposed agreement shall be substantially the same in form and content as described on Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- Section 3. The Mayor and the officers, agents and employees of the City are hereby authorized and directed to take such further action and execute such other documents, certificates and instruments as may be necessary or desirable to carry out and comply with the terms of the proposed Contract.
- Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinctive, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.
- Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
- Section 6. This Ordinance shall not be published in the Code of City Ordinances of the City of Pevely, Missouri.

Lessee shall have the right to make such alterations, improvements, and changes to the premises as Lessee may deem necessary, provided the Lessee first gains written consent from the Lessor's Superintendent. Should any such alterations, improvements, or changes be made, Lessee shall have the obligation to restore the premises at the end of the term to the condition at the commencement of this term, at the option of Lessor.

Lessee shall, throughout the term of this Lease, at its own cost, and without any expense to Lessor, keep and maintain the premises, including any and all improvements of every kind which may be a part thereof, in good sanitary, and neat order, condition, and repair. Lessor shall not be obligated to make any repairs, replacements, or renewals of any kind, nature, or description, whatsoever to the deemed premises or any improvements which might be placed thereon except that Lessor will split the cost of the anticipated 2019 spring/summer bridge and erosion repair project, with a total estimated cost of six thousand five hundred dollars and zero cents (\$6,500.00), 50-50 with Lessee.

Lessor shall not be liable for any loss, injury, death, or damage to persons or property which at any time may be suffered or sustained by Lessee or by any person whosoever may at any time be using or occupying or visiting the demised premises or be in, on, or about the same, whether such loss, injury, death, or damage shall be caused by or in any way result from or arise out of any act, omission, or negligence of Lessee or visitor, or user of any portion of the premises, or shall result from or be caused by any other matter or thing whether of the same kind as or of a different kind than the matters or things above set forth, and Lessee shall indemnify Lessor against all claims, liability, loss, or damage whatsoever on account of any loss, injury, death, or damage. Lessee hereby waives all claims against Lessor for damages to the premises or any improvement that are now on or

hereafter placed or built on the premises and to the property of Lessee in, on, or about the premises, and for injuries to persons or property in or about the premises, for any cause arising at any time. However, such indemnification and waiver shall not apply to loss, injury, death, or damage arising by reason of the negligence or misconduct of Lessor, its agents, or employees.

Lessor, not withstanding any provision herein to the contrary, reserves the right to terminate this Lease by giving Lessee written notice of its intention to so terminate at least twelve (12) months in advance of such termination. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 500 OF THE CITY OF PEVELY MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO SECTION 500.090 QUALIFICATIONS OF BUILDING OFFICIAL

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Pevely, Missouri wish to amend the qualifications of the Building Official to a more desirable level of experience; and

WHEREAS, the most appropriate way to amend the qualifications of the Building Official is to repeal and replace in its entirety Section 500.090 of the Pevely Municipal Code which pertains to the qualifications of the Building Official.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PEVELY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 500.090 of the City of Pevely, Missouri Municipal Code is hereby repealed in its entirety and replaced by the following language:

Section 500.090 Qualifications of Building Official



To be eligible for appointment, the appointee shall have previous building experience and shall be generally informed on good engineering and building practices in respect to the design and construction of buildings, the accepted requirements for means of ingress and egress, and the installation of other service equipment necessary for the health, safety, and general welfare of the occupants and the public. The Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall have the sole discretion to determine the appointee's eligibility.

- Section 2. The Mayor and the officers, agents and employees of the City are hereby authorized and directed to take such further action and execute such other documents, certificates and instruments as may be necessary or desirable to carry out and comply with the terms of the proposed Contract.
- Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinctive, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.
- Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

Synopsis of Topic: The Jefferson County Department of Public Health is partnering with the MO-HOPE Project to help train and equip our law enforcement agencies with naloxone. They have the opportunity to host a training of trainers, where each department in the county can send training officers to learn to train officers to respond to an overdose they encounter in the course of their work. The training will cover how to assess and respond to an overdose, as well as an update on Missouri laws related to overdose response. This includes zero liability for officers who administer this life saving medication. Officers trained will receive 3 hours of POST credit, copies of the presentation, and materials needed to apply for their own POST control number. They can then train their departments as time allows. After completion of this training, departments are eligible to receive FREE Narcan for officers. Both the training and Narcan are free for participating agencies.

Title XII PUBLIC HEALTH AND WELFARE

Chapter 190

190.255. Naloxone, first responder may administer, when — definition. — 1. Any qualified first responder may obtain and administer naloxone to a person suffering from an apparent narcotic or opiate-related overdose in order to revive the person.

- 2. Any licensed drug distributor or pharmacy in Missouri may sell naloxone to qualified first responder agencies to allow the agency to stock naloxone for the administration of such drug to persons suffering from an apparent narcotic or opiate overdose in order to revive the person.
- 3. For the purposes of this section, "qualified first responder" shall mean any state and local law enforcement agency staff, fire department personnel, fire district personnel, or licensed emergency medical technician who is acting under the directives and established protocols of a medical director of a local licensed ground ambulance service licensed under section 190.109 who comes in contact with a person suffering from an apparent narcotic or opiate-related overdose and who has received training in recognizing and responding to a narcotic or opiate overdose and the administration of naloxone to a person suffering from an apparent narcotic or opiate-related overdose. "Qualified first responder agencies" shall mean any state or local law enforcement agency, fire department, or ambulance service that provides documented training to its staff related to the administration of naloxone in an apparent narcotic or opiate overdose situation.
- 4. A qualified first responder shall only administer naloxone by such means as the qualified first responder has received training for the administration of naloxone.

Please accept this memo as summary information regarding the request to purchase two (2) new one-ton dump trucks for the Street Department. Supplemental information is attached hereto.

As we discussed with the purchase of the Water Department service truck, the Missouri Department of Transportation ("MoDOT") solicits bids for various items every year including one-ton dump trucks. MoDOT's purchasing process is very thorough and includes issuing formal requests for proposals and awarding the bids to particular dealerships.

Lou Fusz was awarded a bid for Ram trucks and Knapheide was awarded a bid for dump bodies. I would like to purchase the new Ram 3500 chassis and cabs from Lou Fusz and the dump bodies from Knapheide at the MoDOT awarded prices.

We are also planning to purchase snowplows and salt spreaders for these trucks and I would like to purchase those locally from Cost Cutter Snowplows & Equipment. Cost Cutter is located on Front Street in Horine and they sell BOSS brand snow removal equipment. We prefer this brand because it is high quality and most of our existing snowplows and spreaders are BOSS brand. Our employees are familiar with this brand and, if we buy all the same brand, we would only need to purchase replacement parts from one manufacturer that would work on any of our snowplows or spreaders.

The current budget includes \$64,000 for each truck. One of these trucks is being paid for out of the Sewer Department and the other is being paid for out of the Water Department, but both will be used by the Street Department. If this purchase is approved as requested, the total cost for each truck would equal \$63,783.12. Shown on the next page is a breakdown of those costs.
